4. President's Report

Daniel Nagle presented his report to the Delegates:

On behalf of the Executive Committee, I would like to thank the Delegates for your continuing support of the IFSSH and for taking the time from your practices and private lives to participate in this Delegates' Council meeting and the IFSSH.

I also would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to the members of the Executive Committee and Belinda Smith for all their hard work during the past year. The ExCo has joined the Zoom generation meeting quarterly and sometimes more often. Thank you!

Much has been accomplished since we last met in Toronto. I am very pleased to announce that as of December 1, 2023, the IFSSH officially acquired Professor Larry Hurst's Hand Surgery Resource. Dr. Hurst offered this amazing resource to the IFSSH at no cost. Dr. Hurst felt the IFSSH would be the best organization to house and, more importantly, preserve and maintain the Hand Surgery Resource. More on this in the Committee for Educational Sponsorship report.

The first Midterm Course was held in Quito, Ecuador, from January 31 through February 3 of this year, in spite of a national security alert. You will hear more about that from Dr. Fidel Cayon. I must, however, take this opportunity to thank Dr. Cayon, Dr. Gabriel Alegria, President of the Ecuadorian Hand Society, and their team for their courage and tenacity and for putting on a spectacular course at the "center of the world."

March found our Secretary General David Warwick and me in Washington, DC, for the Triennial Congress site visit. The ASSH has taken on the dual roles of host society and professional congress organizer (PCO). Natalie Hinman, the ASSH Director of meetings, is coordinating the PCO side, while Jim Chang, past President of the ASSH, is doing a superb job chairing the IFSSH Triennial Congress Committee. David Ruch, President of the American Association for Hand Surgery (AAHS) and Nash Naam, AAHS Immediate Past President, spearheaded the amazingly popular Pre-congress Traveling Fellowship. Drs. Chang and Ruch have much to share with you in their reports.

The ExCo understands the increasing importance of social media in 21st-century communications. Professor Jin Bo Tang, our Communications Director, will, among other things, update you on how the IFSSH is leveraging electronic communications to promote its mission.

I believe we are approaching a pivotal moment in the Federation's history. We have come a long way since 1966, when the IFSSH was founded by eight hand surgeons on a cold January day in Chicago during the annual American Society for Surgery of the Hand meeting. Interestingly, while the IFSSH was founded in 1966, its first meeting was not held until 1980, right here in Rotterdam. Also, it's interesting to note that our logo was designed by the Dutch artist Kees DeVries.

From its inception, the Federation has been dedicated to the dissemination of hand surgery knowledge around the world. Initially, this involved the publication of a textbook on hand surgery nomenclature. This expanded to include the work product of the IFSSH Scientific Committees, which produced expert opinion monographs covering many areas of hand surgery. Since 1980, the IFSSH Triennial Congresses have constituted a significant Federation activity. However, over time, the philanthropic activities of the IFSSH have increased thanks to the gradual improvement of the Federation's financial health. It is the ExCo's perception that to continue, and to expand such philanthropic endeavors, the IFSSH must identify additional funding sources beyond dues payments. To that end, the ExCo has begun considering the creation of an IFSSH fundraising campaign. Greg Bain has created a proposed capital campaign roadmap, while I have been investigating the engagement of professional fundraising consulting firms. Dr. Greg Bain will provide an update on this project.

Thank you again for your support. I look forward to an exciting nine months as we prepare for the 16th Triennial Congress in beautiful Washington, DC. Please put March 24 -28, 2025, on your calendars! I hope to see you there!

5. Member Society applications

David Warwick advised that the Sri Lankan Society for Surgery of the Hand (SLSSH) has applied for IFSSH membership, with letters of support from the Indian, Malaysia and Singaporean hand surgery societies. The IFSSH ExCo has reviewed the application and recommends that the Delegates' Council admit SLSSH to IFSSH membership.

Motion: To admit the Sri Lankan Society for Surgery of the Hand (SLSSH) to IFSSH membership.

Proposed: David Warwick Seconded: Raja Sabapathy Carried unanimously

This decision will be conveyed to Dr Dilshan Munidasa (President, SLSSH) and Dr Gayan Ekanayake (Honorary Secretary, SLSSH). In their absence, Dr Melanie Amarasooriya, an SLSSH member, was welcomed to the IFSSH Delegates' Council Meeting.

6. Secretary-General's Report

a. Finance Report

A spreadsheet of annual income and expenses was provided to the Delegates in advance of the meeting (Appendix A). David Warwick elaborated that the IFSSH income is mostly provided through annual membership dues (stable income), triennial congress profits (unpredictable and only every third year) and the investment portfolio (unstable income dependent on the stock market, with variable results over the IFSSH history).

The IFSSH treasury totals \$2,495,617.85 (at 30th April 2024). There is a trend that financial outgoings are now exceeding the stable income with \$165K of expenses last year. The substantial portions of the expenses relate to CES grants, ExCo travel reimbursements, secretariat salaries, the Ezine, and legal/accounting fees. The acquisition of the Hand Surgery Resource will also now add to daily expenses.

The IFSSH treasury continues to grow but the basis of this is unstable income.

b. Call for Nominations

David Warwick reminded Delegates that the Call for Nominations was shared through an official email to Delegates at the timing stipulated by the IFSSH policies, as well as within Secretary-General newsletters and the Ezine.

Items within the Call for Nominations are:

- 2025 Pioneers of Hand Surgery
- Executive Committee and Nominating Committee members: 2025-2028
 - Secretary-General (NB: 2025-2031 position)
 - Communications Director

- 5x Executive Committee Members-at-Large (regional representation)
- 2x Nominating Committee Members-at-Large
- 2nd IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery (2026-2027) host society
 - allocated to the Europe/Africa region
- 3rd IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery (2029-2030)
 - allocated to the North/Central America region
- 18th IFSSH Triennial Congress (2031) host society
 - allocated to the South America region

The submission process and deadlines for each are within the Call for Nominations documentation. All Delegates should discuss these items with their society Boards.

7. Committee for Educational Sponsorship (CES) Report

Raja Sabapathy, CES Chair, noted that the purpose of the IFSSH is to coordinate the activities of societies, further education and support practices of hand surgery across the world. The CES is pivotal at ensuring financial support is available where needed.

The acquisition of the Hand Surgery Resource (HSR) in 2023 is a huge asset to the IFSSH's education portfolio. This global online education program is available free of charge to any user worldwide. Dr Hurst will continue to oversee the HSR but the IFSSH will provide the financial support for its logistics.

The HSR newsletter is distributed to 18,000 people worldwide, demonstrating the reach and impact of its education. The intellectual property is a gift from Dr Hurst, for which the IFSSH is very grateful and will continue to build on.

To assist Dr Hurst with the workload of maintain the HSR and its content, the IFSSH has proposed the formation of the International Hand Surgery Resrouce Advisory Group (IHSRAG). There are 450 clinical sections included in the HSR, each reviewed over a 5 year cycle (i.e. 90 sections/year). The IHSRAG will share this load; the more IHSRAG members, the fewer sections that each individual needs to review. It is also a vehicle to share your specific knowledge on a topic.

Raja Sabapathy invited all IFSSH Delegates to become IHSRAG members. The current list is on the IFSSH website: https://ifssh.info/hand-surgery-resource.php. Any interested person should contact the IFSSH secretariat: administration@ifssh.info.

Recent CES financial contributions to enabling and enhancing hand surgery education worldwide have included:

 \$20,000 to the 2025 IFSSH Congress hosts, specifically to be directed to the 2025 IFSSH-AAHS/ASSH Travelling Fellowship program. This was a great success in the UK in 2022 with young hand surgeons from all parts of the world joining together. The CES thanks the American hosts for continuing this, with the AAHS taking the lead role.

- \$18,000 pledged to the Current Practice of Hand Surgery textbook to support editorship and publication costs.
- \$2,000 provided to an educational tour in China: surgeons from Eastern China regions will travel to two Western China provinces to lecture and discuss cases.
 Traditionally the Western regions do not benefit from the same degree of exposure and education as the Eastern region, so this is an excellent way to share knowledge that is also cost-efficient.

Raja Sabapathy appealed to all Delegates to return to their society memberships and source more high-quality CES applications. The CES accepts applications at any time. The process is simple (refer to the Educational Sponsorship tab on the IFSSH website - https://ifssh.info/educational sponsorship.php) and the submission outcome is delivered quickly.

He also highlighted the IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professorship program. Dr Steven Moran was the inaugural Professor, travelling to Australia. Prof Jin Bo Tang then travelled to Poland in 2023 under this scheme.

Any IFSSH society is eligible to host an IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professor. This enables a society to have a distinguished guest participating in activities in their country, while the IFSSH pays for transport and accommodation up to \$15,000) and provides the Professor with an honorarium. The Professor can lecture at meetings, join students and trainees for workshops, visit multiple centres and satellite meetings, teach in cadaver labs, or any other relevant activities that are planned.

The IFSSH is calling for applications for the next society to host an IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professor. Delegates should consider this with their society's Board and apply as per the directions on the IFSSH website (https://ifssh.info/educational_sponsorship.php).

Irek Walaszek, the Polish IFSSH Delegate, passed on his society's thanks to Prof Jin Bo Tang for a memorable and educational visit and presented Prof Tang with a photobook of the Professorship. Dr Walaszek thanked the IFSSH for supporting this opportunity, which inspired the Polish hand surgeons and trainees, and noted such a program and distinguished guest would have been very difficult to fund locally.

8. Communication Director's Report (website, social media and Ezine)

Jin Bo Tang explained that the IFSSH communication methods are used to unite the membership and enhance the mission of the Federation. This consists of X (Twitter), Instagram, and the Ezine – alongside the Secretary-General newsletters and ongoing emails.

Social media posts are prepared and published by the IFSSH Secretariat for the last 18 months, after the accounts were established by British colleagues. Rama Sudakar, the IFSSH Administrative Assistant appointed in December, has taken the lead with this. The posts recognise the planned activity of the IFSSH members – i.e. focussed at the society level. Future consideration is to be given to enhancing timely content. Delegates are requested to send news from their societies that can be shared by the IFSSH.

The website is continually updated. This is maintained by Mr Santhosh Kumar in India. The education sections are now very active, with a lot of resources available to all.

The Ezine is in its 14th year of digital publication. Future plans may include an alteration to three issues per year; the ExCo are considering content, cost and the role of the incoming Communications Director (for 2025-2028) in relation to this.

9. Philanthropy/Fundraising update

Greg Bain, Chair of the IFSSH Philanthropy Committee, addressed the IFSSH Delegates' Council to reveal the IFSSH Patron of Hand Surgery program - https://ifssh.info/hand_surgery_donation_program.php.

This program has been established to ensure that adequate funds are available to support educational projects and the IFSSH purpose into the future. An aim of raising US\$5 million has been set.

A presentation (Appendix B) was shown, explaining the donation process, its uses, and the impact that the IFSSH has on worldwide education. The beneficiaries of IFSSH educational funding each write reports and these are placed on the IFSSH website (https://ifssh.info/ifssh-sponsored-educational-projects.php) — the feedback is outstanding and the impact is wide-reaching.

The donation system has five designated tiers: Super platinum, Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze. LMIC individuals are recognised by halving the donation amount required to reach each level.

A QR code has been generated – this takes the viewer to the IFSSH webpage where a donation can occur via bank transfer and, shortly, by credit card.

The presentation slides and QR code will be shared with Delegates via email following the meeting. Each delegate is requested to share this program with their society's membership.

Greg Bain noted that this is an opportunity for all hand surgeons to engage and give, as a means of supporting the hand surgeons of the future and their education as well as many regions through outreach support.

10. 1st IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery (2024) - Quito, Ecuador

Fidel Cayon, Chair of the 1st Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery, provided the final report of this Course.

493 attendees joined the IFSSH Course in Quito, Ecuador (31 Jan - 3 Feb 2024). Five keynote speakers were invited utilising finance from the IFSSH. An unfortunate State of Emergency caused some difficulties but the meeting proceeded with excellent engagement from the keynote and invited speakers and registrants. A social evening was held at the "centre of the world" monument and was an outstanding success.

Fidel Cayon noted that the State of Emergency and its consequences on registration numbers (and increased costs for security measures) meant that the Course ended in debt. In Ecuador, insurance policies are not available for these types of incidents. It is also expected that invited speakers receive free registration but this was a large number for the Course and also impacted financially. The "Meet and greet" concept was introduced at this meeting, with registrants able to register/pay for a small informal group discussion with an expert. These were not fully subscribed. The organisers believed that the system could be a success in the future now that it has been introduced but it was a hard concept to promote at this first meeting.

On behalf of ECUMANO, Fidel Cayon thanked the ExCo and the Delegates' Council for supporting an international meeting of this scale in Ecuador. Ecuador is a small society and only recently become an IFSSH member; this was an opportunity for the ECUMANO members to show their society and country to the international hand surgeons.

The ExCo and Delegates' Council expressed their gratitude to Fidel Cayon and ECUMANO for the effort and dedication placed into the organisation of the 1st IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery.

11. 16th IFSSH Congress (2025) – Washington D.C., USA

Jim Chang, 2025 IFSSH Congress Chair, addressed the Delegates' Council, noting that this was also on behalf of his AASH co-Chair, David Ruch. Melissa Garcia, ASSH CEO, was introduced, and acknowledgement given to Jeff Friedrich and Jeff Yao, the Scientific Program Chairs.

Jim Chang detailed that the site visit had occurred with members of the IFSSH, IFSHT, ASSH, AAHS and ASHT committees. This was in March, one year prior to the congress commencement, with the cherry blossoms were in full bloom.

Whilst the 2019 Berlin and 2022 London IFSSH meetings included FESSH involvement, the AAHS and ASSH will be proceeding with their own annual meetings in 2025 in addition to the 2025 IFSSH-IFSHT Congress. This makes registration numbers a little uncertain at this stage.

1462 abstract submissions were received, 600+ of these from outside of the US. These are under review at present. Half of the accepted papers will be from international presenters.

The location of the meeting has been carefully considered. The hotel and meeting are in the one space – for convenience and comfort, and no transport will be required. The site is 10 blocks to the White House. Major sites are all accessible.

The program remains similar to established templates used in Berlin and London. The final version will be released in November.

Prof Fu-Chan Wei has been invited to give the Swanson Lecture. The Presidential Lecture will be delivered by James Swanson, an American historian and author of novels, including "Manhunt" that has been turned into a TV series.

The textbook is underway, on the theme of Trauma Reconstruction.

Social events include the Opening Ceremony and Welcome Reception (Monday), the Presidents' Dinner (Tuesday, invite only – the Spy Museum), a SPIN games night (Wednesday) and the Gala Dinner (Thursday – The Smithsonian American Art Museum). Gala tickets are limited to 900 and registrants are encouraged to purchase these early.

Entering the USA can be difficult for some nationalities. The local office has invitation letters available, for use in visa and immigration processes — registration is not required to get one of these letters. Delegates from countries that require visas are asked to share this information with their society membership. The visa process can take time so all should apply now!

The ASSH and AAHS are particularly proud of two schemes for this meeting:

- 1) the IFSSH-AAHS/ASSH Travelling Fellowship program, similar to the 2022 UK program. 24 Fellows will undertake visits to east coast hand surgery units and then join the congress.
- 2) A "Buy One, Get One Free" registration program for LMICs, enabling a registered surgeon to bring their trainee for free.

The ExCo and Delegates' Council congratulated Jim Chang on the organisation of the congress to date.

David Warwick advised that, along with the package of Patron documents, a second package relating to the 2025 IFSSH-IFSHT Congress will also be sent to Delegates after the meeting. This latter package will contain the meeting logo and slides (Appendix C). All Delegates are asked to show these at their own national meetings as well as at any meetings they attend.

12. Business arising from Executive Committee Meeting

David Warwick reiterated the IFSSH Patron of Hand Surgery program announcement, thanking Greg Bain for leading this initiative from inception to reality. This has the potential to grow the IFSSH activity and deliver education to all in need. All Delegates are encouraged to read more on the <u>website</u>.

The IFSSH Executive Committee announced the expansion of the Secretariat. Rama Sudakar (Coimbatore, India) has been appointed as IFSSH Administrative Assistant to support Belinda Smith and undertake secretariat duties. Rama will use the same administration@ifssh.info email address — Delegates should please welcome her via email contact. She will likely join the Washington DC meeting in person.

Daniel Nagle asked the Delegates to pause and consider two influential people:

- 1) Peter Amadio has been a long term advocate of the IFSSH. He has represented the AAHS on the IFSSH Delegates' Council for many years and is a current member of the IFSSH Nominating Committee. Peter Amadio is stepping down from his IFSSH Delegate position after this meeting. His input has been immeasurable and the IFSSH ExCo pass thanks to him for this.
- 2) With sadness, the IFSSH Executive Committee were informed of the passing of Eduardo A. Zancolli. Dr Zancolli Sr had been involved in the IFSSH, especially during the 2016 Buenos Aires Congress at which he was the Congress Chair. His influence on the hand surgery community has been immense, as a mentor and friend. The IFSSH also benefits from the support of Eduardo R. Zancolli, as IFSSH Delegate of the Argentine Society and organiser of the 2016 Triennial Congress. The IFSSH passes its heartfelt condolences to Dr Zancolli Jr on the passing of his father and asked that this be extended to his family and colleagues.

The IFSSH Delegates' Council acknowledged the outstanding contributions of Dr Amadio and Dr Zancolli.







Peggy Boineau, President IFSHT Rotterdam, The Netherlands

IFSHT President, Peggy Boineau (PB)-- Activities since October 2023

- Working with attorney in Switzerland to update the Congress agreement with host society, with effective date targeted for 2031 Congress.
- Developed new process for Congress bids.
 - o Consider joint bids first
 - o If no joint bids are acceptable to the IFSHT (i.e. no established hand therapy society that can host), then standalone bids will be considered
 - For joint bids, the therapy society will be required to have a strong written and signed agreement with the surgery society and must demonstrate ability to financially support the Congress.

 for grant funds from IFSSH.
- IFSHT-IFSSH International Hand Therapy Teaching Awards. Grants up to 1500 USD are available to support therapists teaching hand therapy in less-developed countries. Awarded 1500 USD to a UK hand therapist to travel to Sierra Leone to teach about hand therapy.
- Cristina Alegri Award for Innovation in Hand Therapy: Application period closes 24 September 2024.
- IFSHT Lifetime Achievement Award: Application period closes 24 September 2024

APFSSH Meeting in Singapore

The 13th APFSSH Congress, held with the 9th APFSHT and 8th APWA meetings from May 31 to June 3, 2023, at Singapore Expo, marked the first event since the Covid pandemic. The congress proceeded successfully with 840 participants from 33 countries, featuring 378 abstracts and 171 speakers. The theme "Diverse and Inclusive" was showcased through various sessions, including keynote lectures by Professors Fu Chan Wei, Robert Pho, and Tunku Sara Ahmad. The event also featured a Nurses Symposium and concluded with a memorable Congress Dinner at the Flower Dome in Gardens by the Bay.

APFSSH Book "Crafting a Legacy"

During the Singapore meeting, Drs. Dawn Chia, Sandeep J. Sebastin, and S. Raja Sabapathy launched their book "Crafting a Legacy: The Incredible Lives of Asian-Pacific Hand Surgery Pioneers," published by World Scientific Publishing Company, which also publishes the JHSAP journal. This book features the lives of 48 pioneering hand surgeons from the Asian-Pacific region, offering an in-depth look at their contributions. Each congress participant received a copy, and the authors have donated future royalties to the APFSSH. The first book published by the APFSSH is still available for purchase. Royalties from the book have also been donated by Dr Sandeep Sebastin to the society.

New Memberships

The United Arab Emirates and Nepal have both submitted applications for membership in the APFSSH. We have also received 2 individual applications for Associate Membership from Vietnam.

Educational Activities

APFSSH Travelling Fellowship

This year we launched the APFSSH Travelling Fellowship. Dr Wendy Teo, a newly qualified Hand Surgeon from National University Health System, Singapore was awarded the inaugural Travelling Fellowship to enhance her expertise in wrist conditions and arthroscopy. She will learn advanced surgical techniques and management practices, establish connections with international peers and foster future collaborations during her 2-week observership with Prof Shih Jui Tien, Prof Wang Jung-Pan, and Dr Huang Chao-Yi from our member country, Taiwan. She will also participate in the 9th Asia Pacific Wrist Association Annual Congress and an advanced wrist arthroscopy course. Congratulations Wendy!

APFSSH Visiting Professorship

In 2023, we also launched the APFSSH Visiting Professorship. It aims to provide funding for member societies to invite a senior surgeon to their scientific meeting, who will also visit and teach at 1-2 other institutions. The Visiting Professor, ideally a keynote speaker, is expected to make significant contributions to the conference and the educational program. Member societies must apply to the APFSSH Education Committee with a detailed plan and secure free registration and assistance for the professor's travel and accommodation. The APFSSH funds one professor annually with \$5000 SGD. Post-visit, the organizing committee must report the outcomes to the APFSSH, with an expected presentation at the next APFSSH congress or newsletter.

Diversity and Inclusivity

The Asian Pacific Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (APFSSH) is committed to promoting diversity and inclusivity within the field of hand surgery. Signing the International Orthopaedic Diversity Alliance (IODA) Charter on 17 March 2024 (https://www.orthopaedicdiversity.org) and appointing a diversity subcommittee for APFSSH underscores our dedication to creating an equitable environment that values diverse perspectives and backgrounds. This commitment ensures that our organization fosters a culture of inclusion, supporting a wide range of voices and experiences in all its initiatives and activities.

Website and Social Media

Our website, www.apfssh.net, serves as a primary communication channel for our members and the broader community interested in Hand Surgery and Hand Conditions. In addition to our website, we actively engage with our community through our Facebook page (@apfssh). In 2024, we just started our Instagram account (@APFSSHand). We encourage all members to utilize these platforms to share news about their societies and any events they are organizing.

Young Surgeons Forum

Our President has proposed developing a Young Surgeons Forum within the Asian Pacific Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand (APFSSH) to encourage young surgeons to network and to present their work without feeling intimidated by senior members. APFSSH Exco is supportive of this. Dr Ahire (MAL) is supportive of introducing a session for young members during the upcoming APFSSH in India in September 2025. We currently already have a Facebook forum for young Asian hand surgeons (https://www.facebook.com/groups/248440585912198), which is part of the APFSSH Facebook groups.

Foundation Course in Hand Surgery

The FESSH Academy, Asia Pacific Federation of Societies for Surgery of the Hand, and the Malaysian Society for Surgery of the Hand are organizing a Foundation Course in hand surgery in Kuala Lumpur from August 5-7, 2024. The three-day course includes lectures, practical sessions, and discussion groups and is suitable for senior trainees and experienced surgeons. It will be followed by the Annual MSSH meeting. The course features an experienced international faculty and is sponsored by industry partners. 



Latin American Federation of Hand Surgery (FLACM) Report

Activities of the Latin American Federation of Hand Surgery during the first half of 2024

According to the planning carried out by the new management, the following events were successfully held:

• On December 8th and 9th, 2023, in Montevideo, the 1st Combined Meeting with the Uruguayan Society of Hand Surgery was held with great success. The event was attended by their President, Dr. Matías Craviotto, and FLACM President Dr. Sergio Daroda, along with prestigious guests such as Drs. Fernando Menvielle, Gabriel Clembosky and Ezequiel Zaidenberg from Argentina, Antonio Costa from Brazil, and physical therapists Jannine Hareau (Uruguay), Fernanda Coscueta, and Yamila Nicora (Argentina).



 Additionally, FLACM joined IFSSH and Ecumano during the IFSSH Mid Term Course held in Quito, Ecuador on February 1st, 2024. They coordinated a Microsurgery Case Symposium with a panel of experts from numerous countries in the region: Drs. Sergio Daroda and Fernando Menvielle (Argentina), Alfonso Pérez (Chile), Christian Castro (Costa Rica), Gabriel Alegría (Ecuador), Joaquín Díaz (Mexico), and Bruno Pietrapianna (Peru).



 On April 5th and 6th, 2024, the 1st Congress of the Paraguayan Society of Hand Surgery was successfully held in Asunción, in collaboration with FLACM. The event was attended by their president, Dr. Juan Carlos Alvarenga, and featured presentations by Drs. Sergio Daroda, Fernando Menvielle, Guillermo Belluschi, Agustín Donndorff, Cecilio Argañaraz from Argentina, Ricardo Kaempf from Brazil, and Jorge Terrazas from Bolivia among other speakers.



 On May 22nd, the FLACM Virtual Session was organized, hosted by the Colombian Association of Hand Surgery (ASOCIMANO), led by Drs. Luis Felipe Náquira and Fabio Suárez. The session featured presentations of three original techniques by Drs. Felipe Mesa, Alejandro Sandoval, and Carlos Arroyo.
